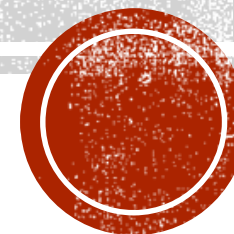


THE SULTAN'S DAUGHTER



UNDERSTAND THE STORY

EXPLORE LANGUAGE AND LITERACY DEVICES

1. Ali and Radjab collect three items on their way to the city; Radjab follows the princess to the witch's cave three times; there are three riddles for Ali to answer.
2. C- The reader can predict what is coming next, but knows there will be a twist, which creates a feeling of anticipation.
3. Not knowing who Radjab is; the threat of execution for Ali if he does not answer the riddles.
4. A fakir with puppets that dance; Radjab ointment; a flying princess; a witch; birds' wings that make Radjab fly
5. Own answer with reason like I like the ending because Ali is a good person and he was rewarded for paying the man's debt.
